EXPLORER POST #409

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office **Explorer Post #409** is chartered by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America. It was established in 1984 to educate our youth about law enforcement procedures through training and service. Male and female candidates must be 14 (and completed the 8th grade) to 21 years of age, must maintain a minimum C average in middle school, high school or college, and will appear before Explorer Officers for an oral interview.

Explorers assist the Sheriff's Office by participating in community service by providing traffic control and parking at various events.

Explorers receive training from certified law enforcement instructors in all areas of police work, including traffic stops and crash investigations, crisis intervention, and crime scene investigations. They are also offered a firearms familiarization and safety class.

Hernando County Civilian Mounted Unit

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office Civilian Mounted Unit is comprised of civilian volunteers who assist the Sheriff's Office Mounted Unit. The Sheriff's Office Mounted Unit is comprised of sworn deputies. The Unit is trained to search the woods for missing people, control crowds, deter parking lot crime, and march in formation.

The Civilian Mounted Patrol involves a lot more than owning a horse and showing up to march in parades. Riders and their horses must have 40 hours of training completed and qualify before joining the unit.

The Sheriff's Office Mounted Unit and Civilian Mounted Unit train together, working on search and rescue, desensitization and other drills.
