#### Catherine Allen's physical appearance is as follows:



### Purple Alerts are issued for Missing Adults who meet one or more of the criteria listed below.

- The individual has a mental or cognitive disability that is not Alzheimer's disease or a dementia-related disorder; an intellectual or developmental disability (brain injury, physical/mental/emotional disability not related to substance abuse, or any combination of these).
- The disappearance indicates a credible threat of immediate danger or serious bodily harm to him or herself, as determined by local law enforcement.
- The individual cannot be returned to safety without law enforcement intervention.
- The individual does not meet the criteria for activation of a local Silver Alert or the Silver Alert Plan of the Department of Law Enforcement.
