The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is seeking assistance from the public and our media partners in locating **Missing JUVENILE**, **Tamya Chloe Johnson DOB**/09-23-2007, and her infant daughter, **Ke-Ari James**.

Tamya was last seen during the morning hours of o6-16-2024 from a residence on Mayflower Road in Spring Hill. She left the residence with her infant daughter and has not returned to the residence.

## The Office of Sheriff:

The Office of the Sheriff is established by the Florida Constitution. As a constitutional officer, the Sheriff has the exclusive authority to administer his or her agency and is responsible for preserving the peace throughout the entire county, carrying out the laws of the state, the orders of Florida courts, and the ordinances of the Board of County Commissioners. The Sheriff is the chief law enforcement and correctional officer of the county.

Sheriff Al Nienhuis was initially appointed as the Sheriff of Hernando County by the Governor in January of 2011. He was then elected by the people of Hernando County in 2012, ran unopposed in 2016, and was reelected in 2020. Sheriff Nienhuis remains accountable to the people of Hernando County.
