Silver Alert

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is requesting assistance from our media partners and the community in locating a **MISSING ENDANGERED ADULT**.

A Silver Alert has been issued.

Mr. Spencer was last seen by a family member the night of 06-30-2024 at his residence on Arrowhead Avenue in Spring Hill. When the family member woke up at 7 a.m. on 07-01-2024, Mr. Spencer had already left the residence.

Mr. Spencer has been diagnosed with dementia.

Mr. Spencer is believed to be driving a white 1994 Chevrolet S-10 bearing Florida tag BS77AV (with metal on the right fender showing). The tag is located in the back window. The vehicle is also carrying a green John Deere lawn mower in its bed.

Mr. Spencer's vehicle was last spotted in Osceola County.

The Sheriff is the chief law enforcement and correctional officer of the county.

Sheriff Al Nienhuis was initially appointed as the Sheriff of Hernando County by the Governor in January of 2011. He was then elected by the people of Hernando County in 2012, ran unopposed in 2016, and remains accountable to them.
